SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

The Palos Verdes Peninsula Unified School District serves the communities of Palos Verdes Estates, Palos Verdes Peninsula, Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, and Rolling Hills Estates. The area is 21 miles southwest of metropolitan Los Angeles and draws predominantly middle to high-income business and professional residents. The District's reputation for having a superior educational system attracts many families to this suburban area and its schools. Two early childhood centers, ten elementary schools, three intermediate schools, one continuation high school, and two comprehensive high schools accommodate approximately 11,400 students in the District.

THE SCHOOL

Palos Verdes Peninsula High School (PVPHS) is a 4-year comprehensive public high school, nationally recognized for academic excellence. PVPHS is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and has regularly received six-year accreditations.

The school follows a traditional semester schedule, with seven 53 minute periods in the school day. Freshmen and sophomores are required to take 6 classes each semester, juniors 5 classes and seniors 4 classes. The District allows students to take as many classes as they wish above the minimum. For the class of 2019, 99.83% of the students graduated, 88% completed more than the minimum requirements, and 83% met the A-G requirements thus qualifying for admission to University of California campuses.



RANKINGS AND RECOGNITIONS

PVPHS is routinely recognized as an exemplary high school at local, state, and national levels. In 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2019 a PVPHS student received the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program Award, the highest honor for graduating high school seniors in the nation.

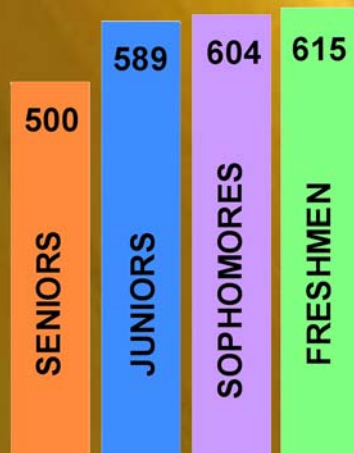

INTERNSHIPS AND WORK EXPERIENCE

The work experience program allows students to gain practical experience in a variety of jobs in industry, business, or the professions. Students receive a grade and school credit for work and related instructional assignments.

Upperclassmen may interview for summer internships with local industry partners. Weekly instructional assignments and student journals and portfolios complement the students' career exploration.

Up to 40 credits (5 credits per semester) may be applied toward the total graduation credit requirement through successful completion of these programs.

In each semester, the maximum number of weighted points available is 1.0 (5 courses), for a highest possible GPA of 5.0

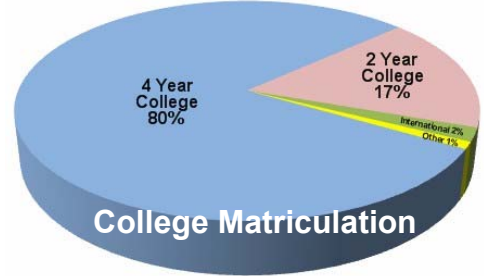
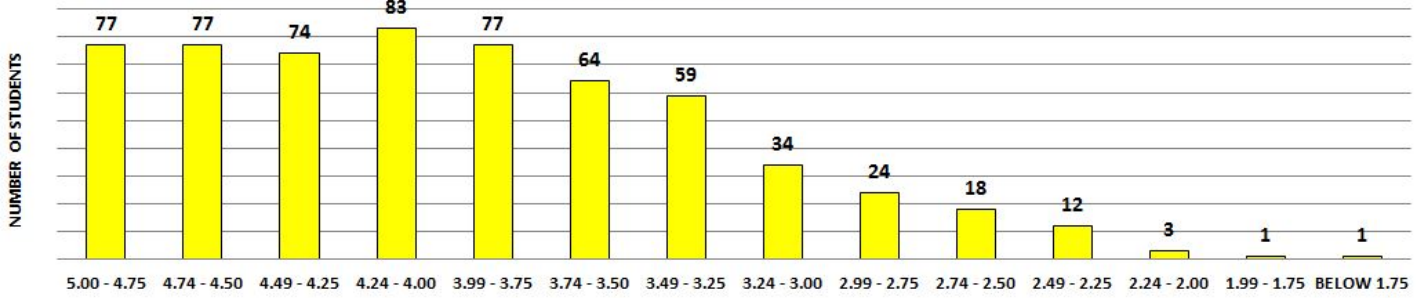

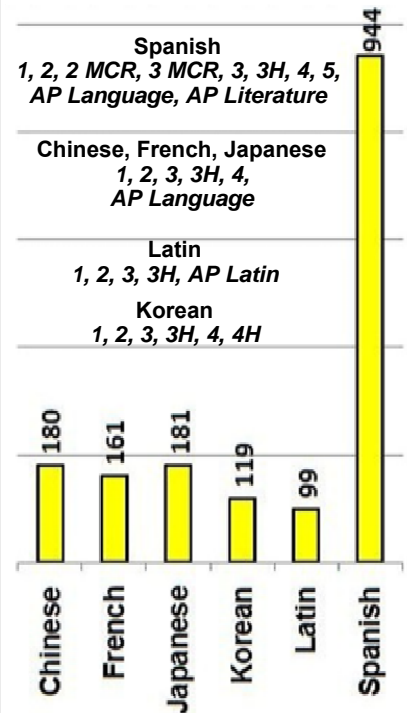

WORLD LANGUAGE IN THE INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL

Palos Verdes Unified School District intermediate school students have the opportunity to enroll in PVPHS world language courses through the second level. This course work does NOT appear on the high school transcript.

Science, Mathematics, Engineering, Research, Technology (SMERT)

The SMERT program introduces students to scientific principles, mathematical concepts, engineering fields, research, and technological skills. Our technology classroom building houses industry-leading 3D design software, state-of-the-art computer labs, 3D printers, and CNC machines. Through our partnership with Project Lead the Way we are able to offer college level curriculum. Classes include AP Computer Science (Java), AP Computer Science Principles, Intro to Engineering Design, Digital Electronics, Principles of Engineering, Aerospace Engineering, Civil Engineering and Architecture, Engineering Design and Development research, and Web design. Our new VEX program allows students to design and build their own robots. Peninsula SMERT students compete regionally and nationally on our Science Fair, FRC Robotics, Cyber Patriot, TSA TEAMS, Science Olympiad, Science Bowl, Ocean Bowl, Math and Physics Teams, and Solar Engineering teams. Furthermore, our students intern during summer with local industry.

Science Research

Our nationally and internationally recognized program allows students to work with experts in a wide variety of science disciplines. PVPHS students have been highly successful in local, state, national, and international competitions.

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)

PVPHS has 166 students enrolled in the AVID program. The mission of AVID is to ensure that all students succeed in a rigorous college preparation program. PVPHS provides AVID students intensive support with tutorials and strong student/teacher relationships.

Mock Trial

Students prepare for and argue legal cases in front of a panel of judges and attorneys in local and regional competitions. The Constitutional Rights Foundation sponsors the Mock Trial Program at PVPHS.

Model United Nations (MUN)

MUN is a highly acclaimed academic program that stresses the skills of debate, research, collaboration, and cooperation through representing a variety of countries in competition.

Speech and Debate

Speech and Debate focuses on developing student skills in public speaking and argumentation in a competitive format.

Teen Court

PVPHS has an on-campus courtroom. Supervising judges from the Superior Court of L.A. County work closely with students enrolled in Teen Court. Students are exposed to the realities of the legal system as members of the jury.

Advanced Projects

This program allows students to augment the curricular experience through completion of a comprehensive project at an accelerated pace.

Student Clubs

There are more than 100 student organized clubs active on campus. Each fall students can apply to charter a club in the areas of academics, politics, culture, religion, athletics, philanthropy, and special interests. Currently, chartered student clubs include: Best Buddies, The Bowling Pens, Rock Band Club, Girl Up, LGBT United, Mobile App Development, Key Club, Hug a Shrub, and many more!

School Publications

The school yearbook, *La Pantera*, is renowned throughout the country as a recipient of multiple state and national awards.

The school newspaper, *The Pen* has been honored with the NSPA First Class rank as well as the NSPA's Best of Show award.

The PVPHS literary magazine, *Beard Full of Butterflies*, provides students the opportunity to submit original writings, photos, and art work for publication.

Eye of the Panther (EOP)

The EOP program is a weekly newscast that is written, edited, directed, and filmed entirely by PVPHS students.

Arts Education

PVPHS has a long history of excellence and innovation in the Visual Arts. Our on-campus Bradbury Smith Art Gallery, which hosts student art shows throughout the year, reflects our ongoing commitment to the visual arts in our learning community. Students have the opportunity to pursue personal interests in:

Ceramics, Sculpture, Glassblowing, Drawing and Painting, Photography, Video Production, Digital Animation, Graphic Design, Jazz and Concert Band, Orchestra, Marching Band, Chamber Choir, Jazz Choir, Women's Choir, Drama, Musical Theater, and Choreography and Dance.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

More than 300 PVPHS students participate in our five award winning leadership programs.

Associated Student Body (ASB)

The ASB Leadership class organizes student activities at PVPHS.

The 37 elected and appointed ASB officers implement activities on campus with the ultimate purpose of creating a welcoming, inclusive, and spirited school environment.

Link Crew

Link Crew is a high school transition program that warmly welcomes all freshmen and transfer students to PVPHS. The program is designed to help new students throughout their first year at our school.

Peer Leaders Uniting Students (PLUS)

PLUS is a peer-to-peer student leadership program that empowers students to identify and address issues that promote positive youth development and the conditions for student learning.

Service Learning Leadership

The Service Learning Leaders serve our school and extended communities. After examining local and global issues, these students actively volunteer with and contribute to many causes, while raising awareness of social justice issues on our campus.

Principal's Advisory Council (PAC)

The PAC meets regularly with the principal to discuss ways to improve our campus.
